

## **Eagle Scout Project List and Descriptions- January 2018**

Thank you for your interest in conducting your Eagle Project with the Draper City Trails and Open Space Division. Below you will find a list of projects that are currently available. When you find a project, contact the Parks and Recreation office at (801) 576-6570 to schedule a meeting with the Volunteer Coordinator. However, if you have a project in mind you do not need to choose from the list below and you can discuss your ideas with the Volunteer Coordinator during your first meeting.

### ***1. Ghost Falls Hiking Trail Construction***

Description:

Eagle Scout will assist Draper City in constructing a new "hiking only" trail in Corner Canyon. The Eagle Scout and his group will use a variety of trail tools to clear the trail's corridor and construct the bench or walking service of the trail. In the process, the group will be removing vegetation, chopping roots and digging along the slope of the hillside. A variety of tools will be used to complete this project including pulaskis, rakes, loppers and saws.

Required Time: 5 hours

Preferred Group Size: 5-20 people

Meeting Location: Ghost Falls Trailhead

### ***2. Hoof N' Boot Trail Improvements***

Description:

Eagle Scout will assist Draper City in improving the Hoof N' Boot Trail in Corner Canyon. The Eagle Scout and his group will use a variety of trail tools to clear the trail's corridor and improve the bench or walking service of the trail. In the process, the group will be removing vegetation and roots from the trail to improve a user's experience. A variety of tools will be used to complete this project including pulaskis, rakes, loppers and saws.

Required Time: 5 hours

Preferred Group Size: 5-10 people

Meeting Location: Carolina Hills Trailhead

### ***3. Line of Sight Improvements on existing trails for safety of users***

Description:

Eagle Scout will assist Draper City in managing user-conflict. The Eagle Scout will lead a group in trimming vegetation in previously identified areas to improve a trail user's line of sight. A variety of trail tools will be used to remove vegetation from these areas including loppers and saws.

Required Time: 5 hours

Preferred Group Size: 5- 10 people

Meeting Location: TBD

#### ***4. Mehraban Wetlands Park Restoration and Cleanup***

Description:

Eagle Scout will assist Draper City in the restoration and cleanup of the Mehraban Wetlands Park. Project will involve transplanting native trees, removing invasive plants and general clean up around the ponds. The Eagle Scout and his group will use a variety of tools to complete these tasks including loppers, saws, axes and rakes.

Required Time: 4 hours

Preferred Group Size: 5- 10 people

Meeting Location: Main parking lot of the Mehraban Wetlands.

#### ***5. Mehraban Wetlands Tree Donation and Installation***

Assist Draper City in the rehabilitation of the Mehraban Wetlands by organizing fundraising efforts to purchase native trees to plant in the wetlands park. Eagle Scout will work with city staff to identify desired tree species. The Eagle Scout and his group will then plant the donated trees.

Minimum Number of Trees: 3 trees

Preferred Group Size: 2- 5 people to help in planting

Meeting Location: Main parking lot of the Mehraban Wetlands.

#### ***6. South Maple Hollow Restoration***

Eagle Scout will assist Draper City in restoring the South Maple Hollow drainage. Project will involve the removal of downed trees and other debris. Tree planting and other erosion control efforts will also be a part of this project. A variety of tools will be used to complete the project including axes, shovels, rakes, saws and loppers.

Required Time: 5 hours

Preferred Group Size 5-20 people

Meeting Location: Maple Hollow Trailhead

#### ***7. Lower Corner Canyon Road Restoration***

Eagle Scout will assist Draper City in restoring the areas disturbed by the Questar Gas Line Project of 2015/16. Project will involve spreading mulch, planting native grass seeds and removing invasive weeds. Other restoration tasks may be included. A variety of tools will be used to complete the project including wheel barrows, rakes and shovels.

Required Time: 5 hours

Preferred Group Size 5-20 people
