CHINESE LANTERNS, also known as Khoom Fay, Paper Lanterns, or Sky Lanterns, are PROHIBITED in any part of Draper City. While these lanterns are beautiful, they can be VERY dangerous. They stay lit for more than 20 minutes and can travel several miles into open grasses and mountainous dry areas and could potentially start a wild fire. We need to keep our community SAFE. Please take caution and avoid using these lanterns.



Time to get WISE---“FIREWISE” in DRAPER

Behavioral science research shows that once people understand there is something they can do to reduce their vulnerability to wild fire, they are more apt to act.


The Firewise Program is being introduced in Draper with the goal to reduce the loss of lives, properties, and resources to wildland fire by building and maintaining communities in a way that is compatible with our natural surroundings. Landowners understandably prefer to make choices related to their surroundings. But we often believe there’s nothing we can do, that wildfire mitigation is too difficult or prohibitively expensive.
