Judge Rules in Favor of Draper City on Candidate Disqualification

Judge cites candidate's failure to provide necessary documentation as required by state law

DRAPER, Utah. – Judge Keith Kelly ruled in favor of Draper City today by dismissing the petition brought by Mr. Hubert Huh, the disqualified City Council candidate who failed to provide the necessary campaign finance disclosure information required by state law.

“We hope this ruling serves as a reminder that no one is above the law,” said Draper City Mayor Troy Walker. “We didn’t make the law, but we are required to strictly enforce it.

Judge Kelly agreed that the City acted appropriately in enforcing the 5:00pm deadline strictly required under state law and that the deadline was missed by Mr. Huh. He found that the City Recorder did her job in informing Mr. Huh regarding the filing deadline.

The judge said that of the twelve candidates running for City Council, eleven candidates submitted their completed financial disclosure information in compliance with state law and that Mr. Huh did not provide his disclosures until 6:38 p.m. on Tuesday, August 6 - much later than the filing deadline.
